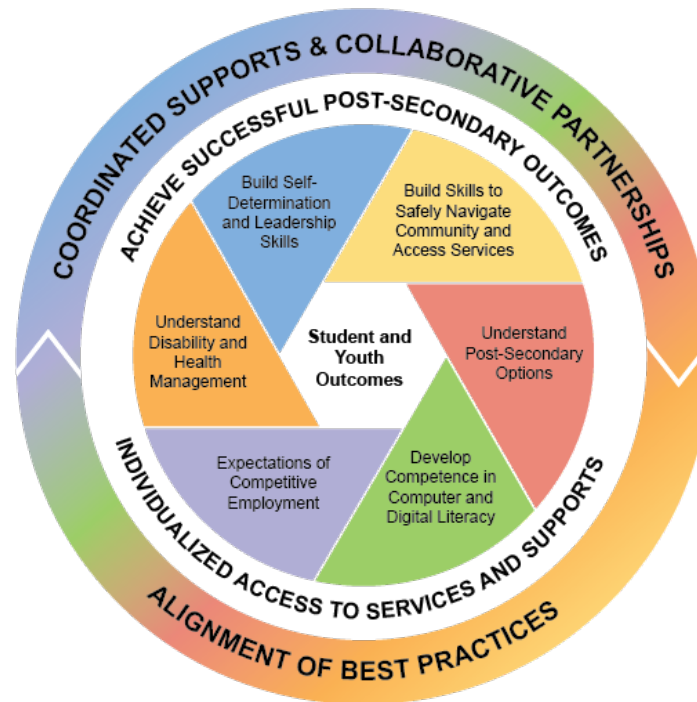

Our Shared State Vision

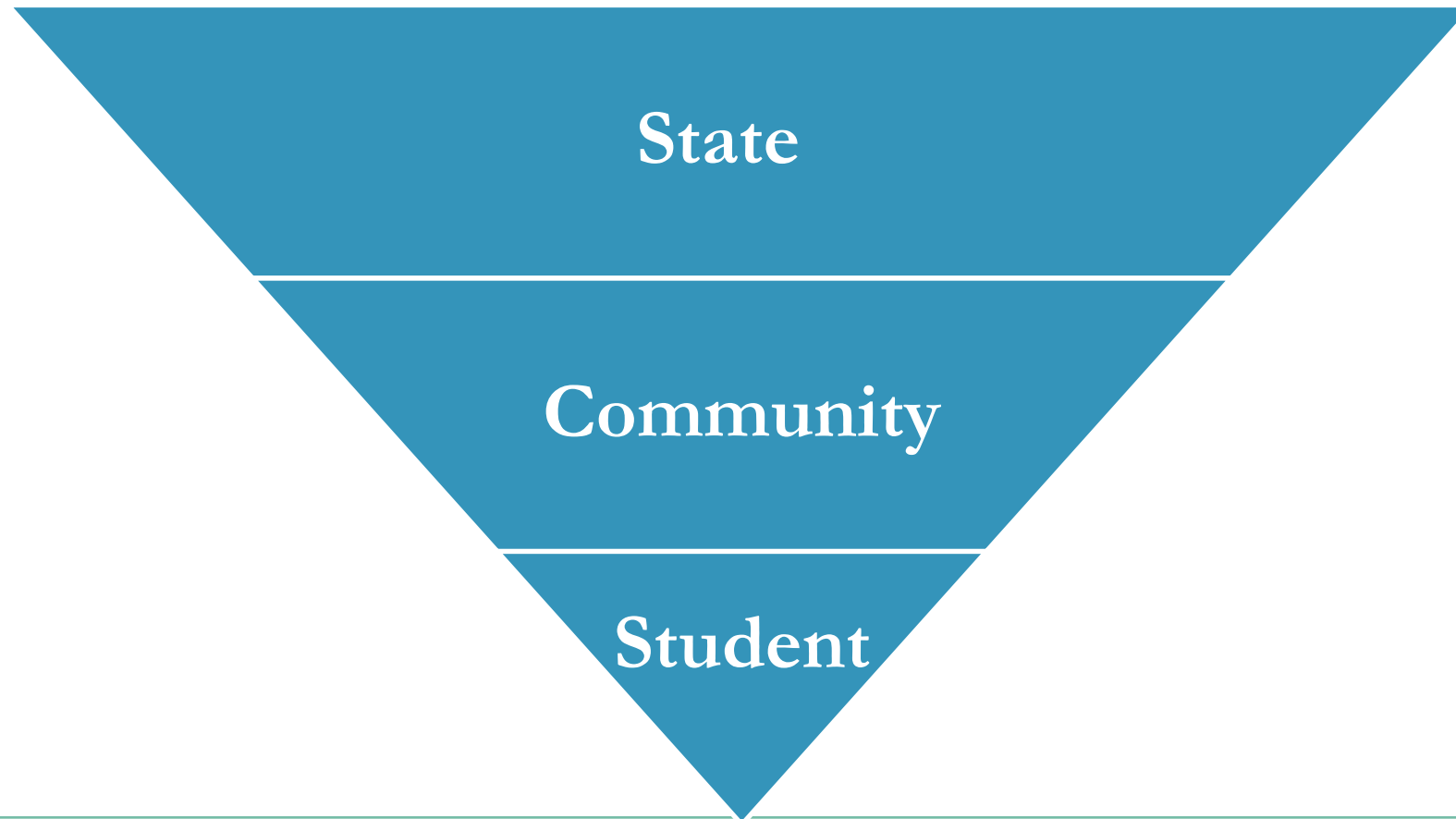
- Partnering at younger ages during high school

- ❖ Understand Disability and Health Management



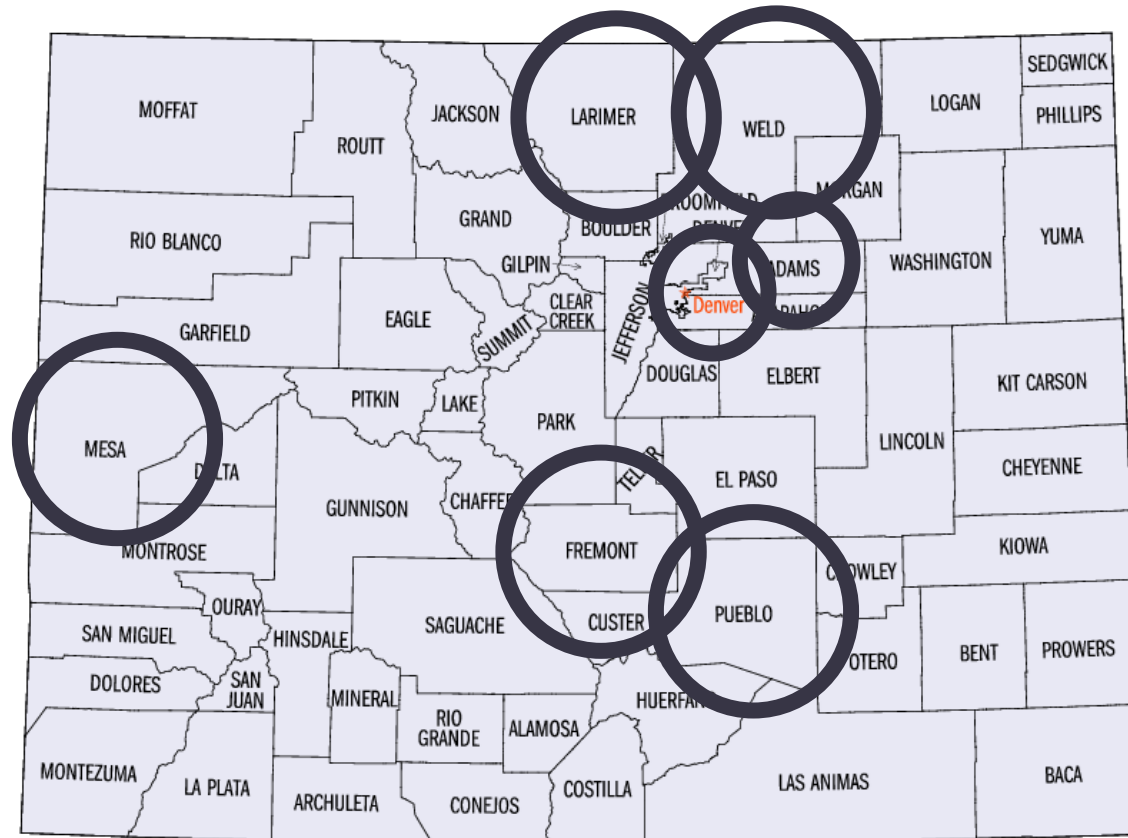
Multiple Levels of Sequencing of Services



Key Components In Operationalizing the Sequence of Services Framework

- Build your Local Interagency Transition Team
- Have a Shared Understanding of Transition Services
- Collaboration with Families is Essential
- Competitive Integrated Employment is an essential goal
- Shared Communication Practices Support the tracking of Student Growth
- Utilizing a Student Driven Process to Support the Student's Vision/Goals

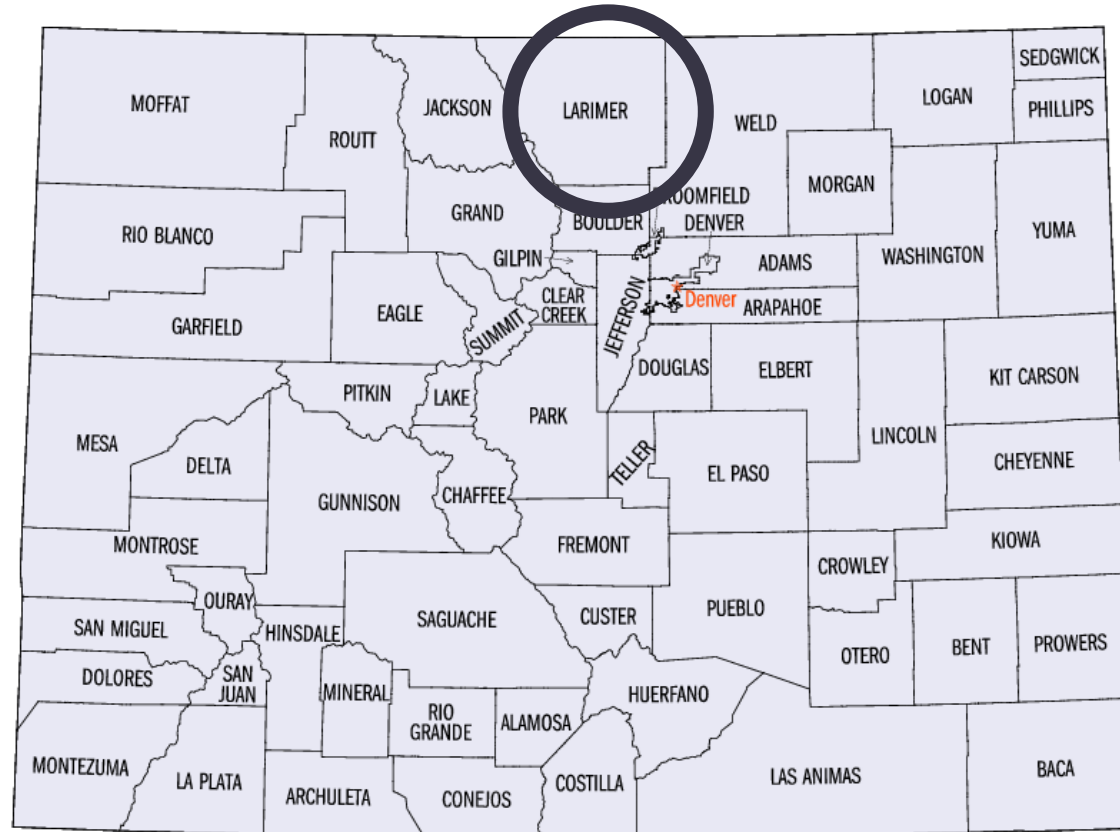

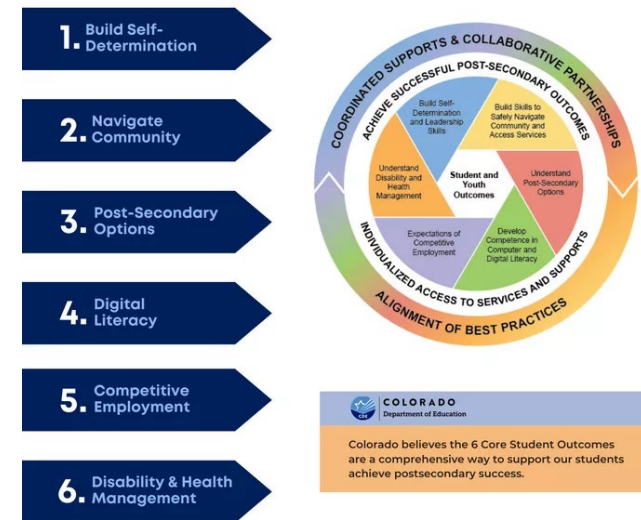


Poudre School District

- Began Community Transition Team (CTT) 2021
- SOS started 2022, stronger CTT with defined purpose
 - Created vision and purpose statements
 - Opportunities to learn from each other, including internally
 - Workbook to highlight local agencies (resources and services)
 - Strength and growth areas
 - Posters, social media, staff training for 2023-24 school year
 - Opportunities to collaborate and learn with and from other district transition teams in Colorado
 - Next year, referral system to discuss individual students and create plan

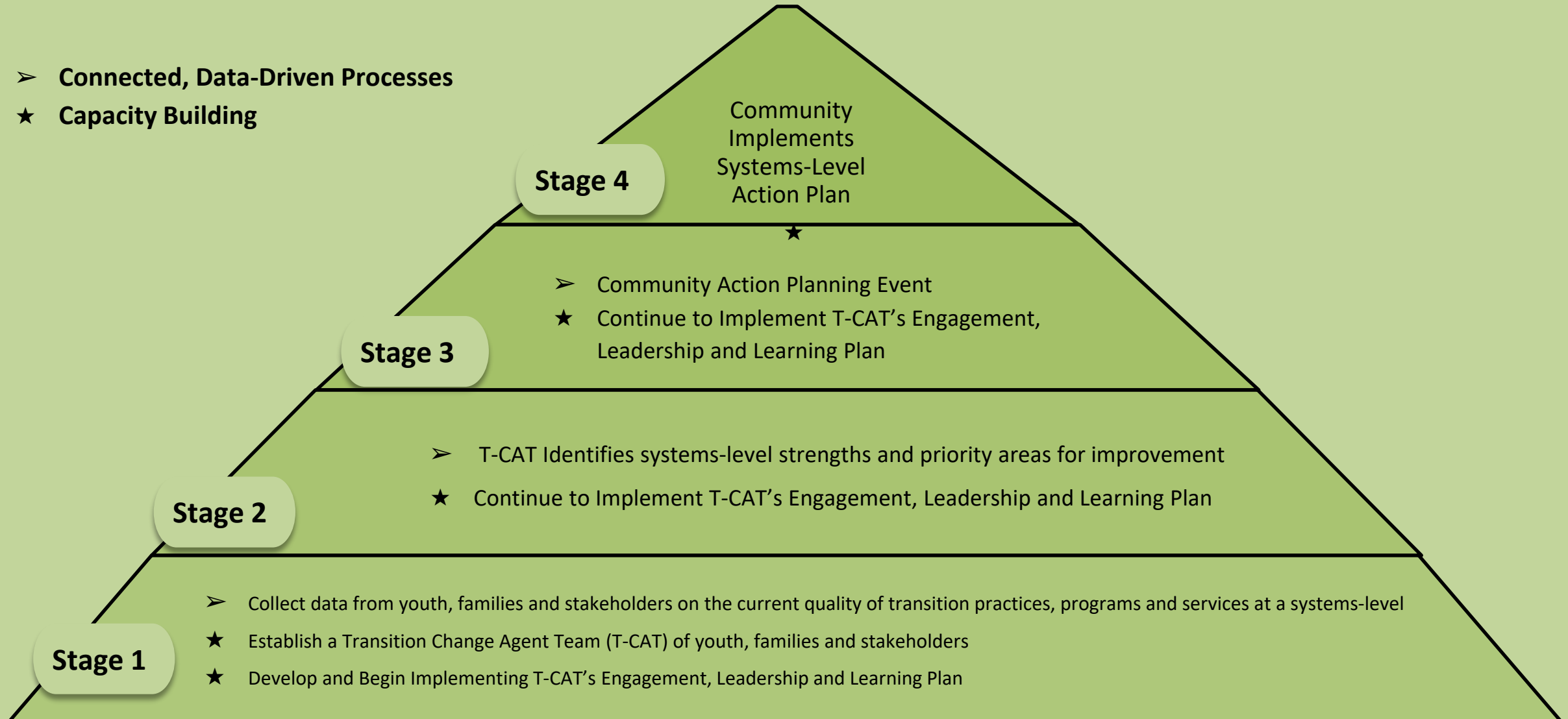

Mission Statements – the “BIG WHY”

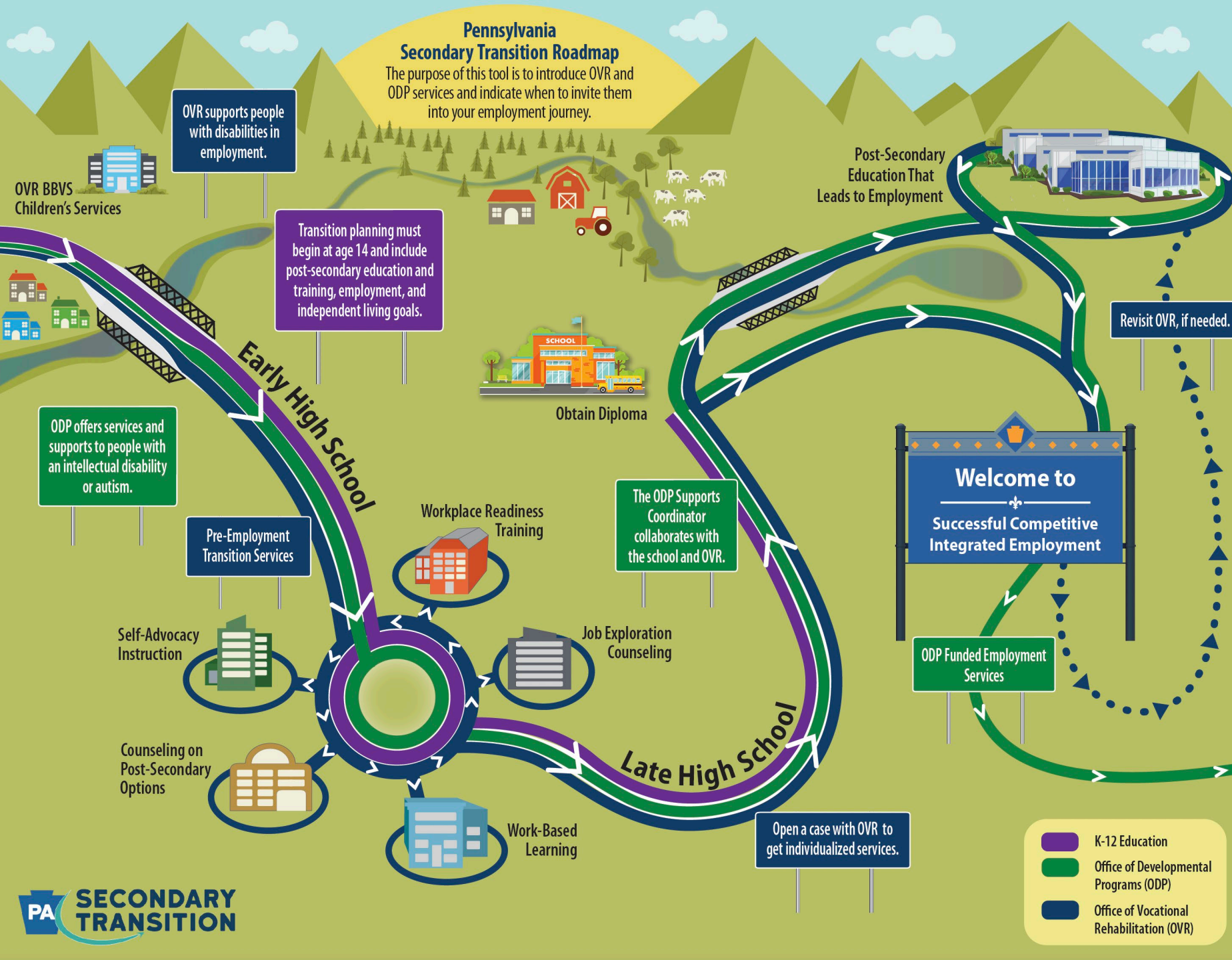
- **BSE:** To ensure that all children with disabilities have available to them a free appropriate public education that emphasizes special education and related services designed to meet their unique needs and prepare them for further education, **employment** and **independent living**.
- **ODP:** To support Pennsylvanians with developmental disabilities to achieve greater **independence**, choice and opportunity in their lives.
- **OVR:** To assist Pennsylvanians with disabilities to secure and maintain **employment** and **independence**.

A seamless human services delivery system that can be effortlessly entered and navigated by individuals with disabilities and their families, should they choose to seek formal supports to secure and maintain competitive integrated employment.

Pennsylvania Secondary Transition Roadmap

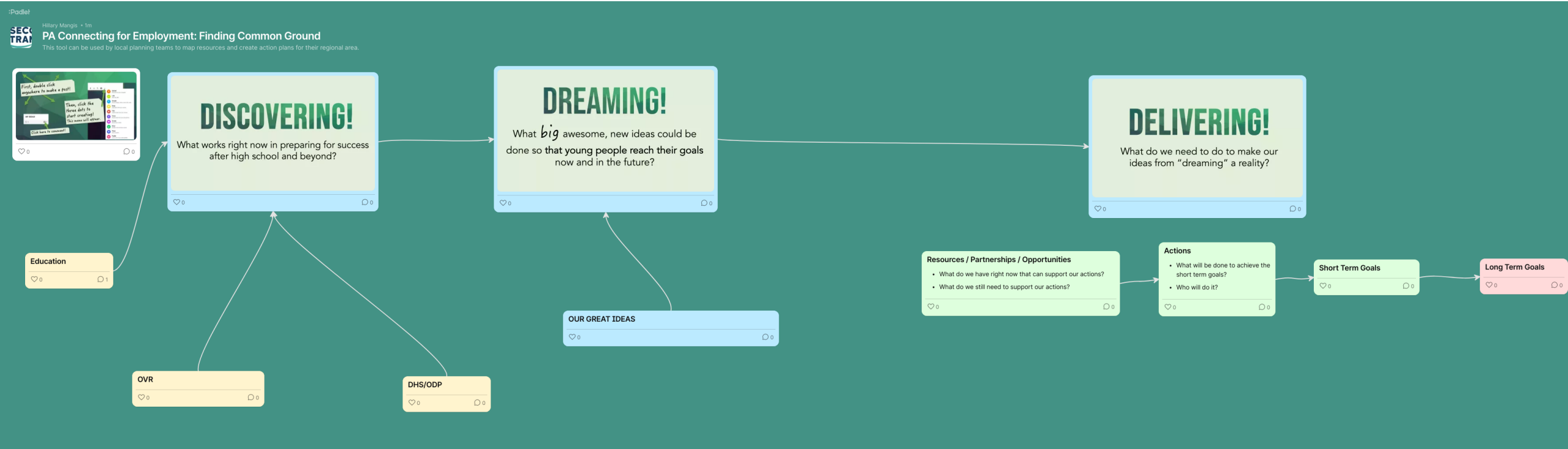

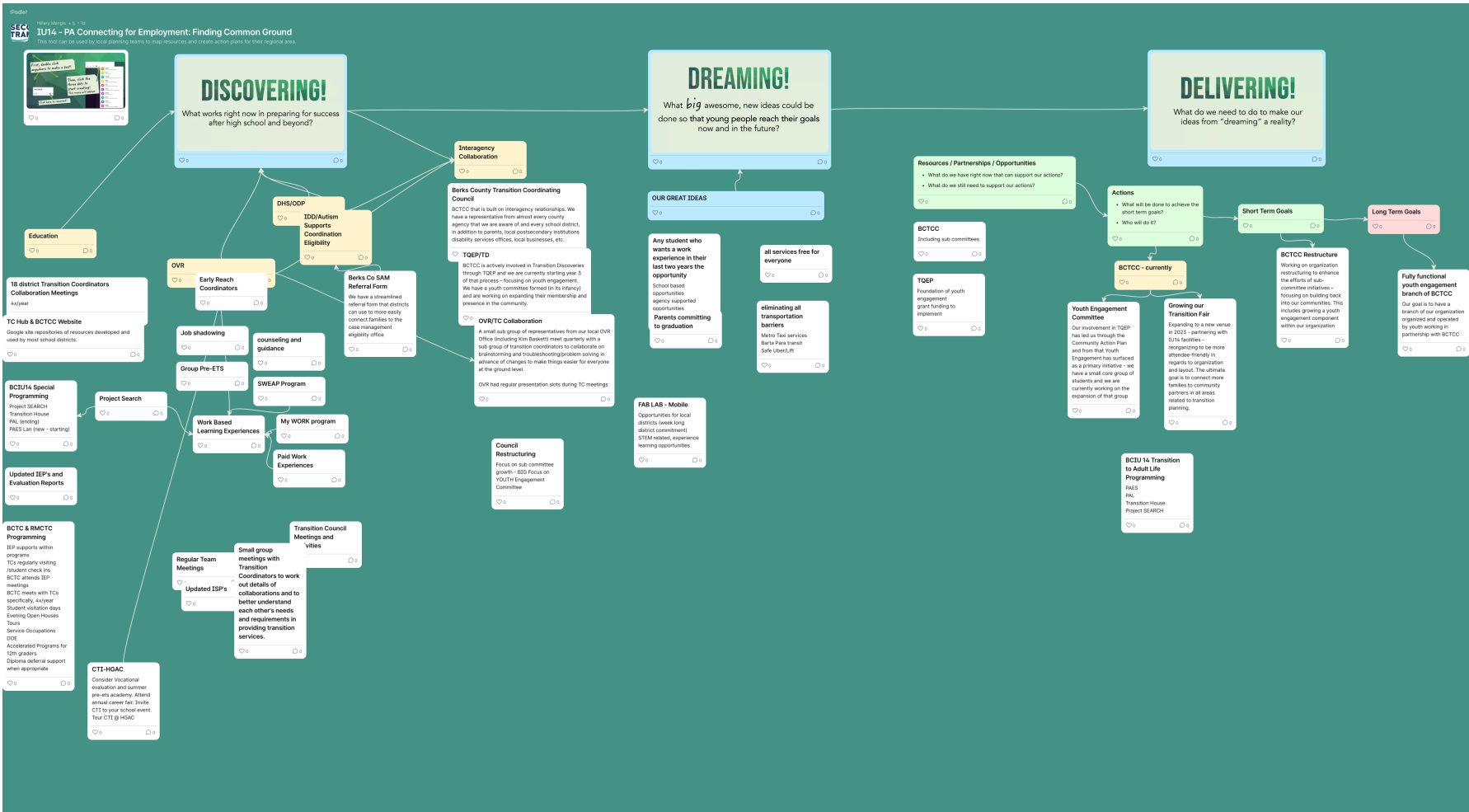
