



IMPACCT is a partnership of New Hampshire Vocational Rehabilitation (NHVR), Granite State Independent Living (GSIL), and high schools throughout New Hampshire. The program is dedicated to helping students with disabilities become part of the local workforce as they navigate from high school to employment, post-secondary education, or training that leads towards a career.



## THE CURRICULUM

The IMPACCT curriculum focuses on five pre-employment transition services, including:

1. Job Exploration Counseling
2. Work-based Learning Experiences
3. Comprehensive Transition Program and Post-Secondary Education
4. Workplace Readiness Training
5. Instruction in Self-Advocacy



## IMPACCT ACADEMY

IMPACCT Academy is a comprehensive program that covers the 5 pre-employment transition services hosted at community college campuses throughout New Hampshire. In small groups (15 student max), students work through an academic curriculum presented as a simulated work environment. Students have the opportunity to earn academic credit through Extended Learning Opportunities (ELOs), with soft skills training braided throughout.

All school districts and alternative placements may participate in IMPACCT Academy.

There are 3 cohorts offered each year - Fall and Spring sessions (14 weeks), as well as Summer sessions (5 weeks).

Scheduling for each session is as follows:

- 4 days/week of academic instruction
- 1 day/week of a work experience
- *Afternoon Computer Lab is also available for credit recovery*

## IMPACCT WORKSHOP

The IMPACCT Workshops are held in schools and at community sites. The Pre-Employment Transition Services are delivered in a small group environment. The participation in and completion of all 5 modules may count for students as an Extended Learning Opportunity (ELO).

IMPACCT Workshops occur throughout the year and are offered through a variety of options - camps, workshops, etc.

Participating students also have access to a dedicated online module focusing on self-advocacy and soft skills training.
